On the Sunny Side of the Street-4/4 (Option: you can use B chord for B7 or A7 for A9 whichever is easier.)

My strum pattern is mostly  $\downarrow \downarrow \uparrow \downarrow \downarrow \uparrow$  The chord name you count as 1 then the dots are 2, 3, 4. There are some combinations that are in two beats G . = 2 beats

Intro: Em7...A7...Am7. D7. G... D7↓↓↓ ↓ ↓

Grab your [G] coat and get your [B7] hat, Leave your [C] worries on the [B7] door-step [Em7] Just direct your [A7] feet To the [Am7] sunny [D7] side of the [G] street [D7] Can't you [G] hear that pitter [B7] pat and that [C] happy tune is [B7] your step.
